How many Christmas elements do you count? Write the number in the box next to it.














The Kinara


HOLIDAYS

Gingerbread Cookies

PREP: 10 MIN • COOK: 10-12 MIN

Ingredients

3 CUPS plain flour

4 TBSP golden syrup

1 TSP bicarbonate soda

1 large egg


2 TSP ground ginger

1 CUP sugar

Method


- 1. pre-heat oven to 200c/180c (fan forced)
- 2. measure the flour and add it into a large mixing bowl
- 3. chop up the butter into small pieces before adding it to the flour
- 4. using your finger tips, rub in the butter until it feels like breadcrumbs
- 5. add ginger, sugar, bicarbonate soda and mix
- 6. add the golden syrup and mix until dough is smooth
- 7. roll out the dough on a lightly floured surface until it is approximately 5mm thick
- 8. cut our ginger bread shapes
- 9. bake in oven for 10–12 minutes until they become a slightly darker shade. Cool slightly then lift onto a wire rack to cool Enjoy!

TBSP = TABLESPOON




Christmas Symmetry
